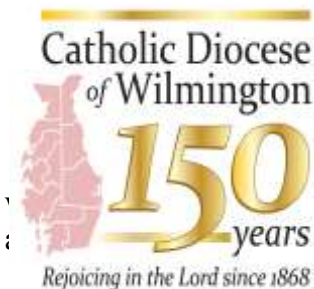

The Diocese of Wilmington was established on March 3, 1868 by Blessed Pope Pius IX.

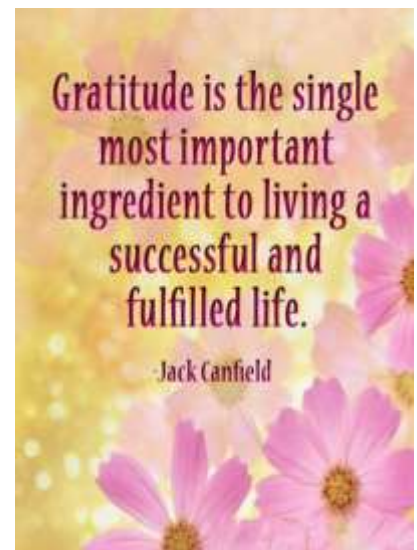
