With that in mind, I have decided to engage an architect to help us finalize the design and to see what we can accomplish with the monies we do have. I'm grateful to all who made the personal sacrifice to see this campaign to completion. In the months ahead, we will have drawings, estimates and all information needed to move forward. The campaign is nearly over and I encourage all families who still have payments to make, to please do so by the deadline so that we'll have an accurate accounting of the total available for renovations. Again, I'm grateful to all for the commitment and sacrifice.
