Those who are eighteen, but not yet sixty are obliged to fast on Good Friday. Fasting is eating only at mealtime and then not as much as usual, just enough to get by. Common sense applies; eat what you need to be healthy. And be mindful of those who are hungry.




Annual Mission Breakfast of Champions
