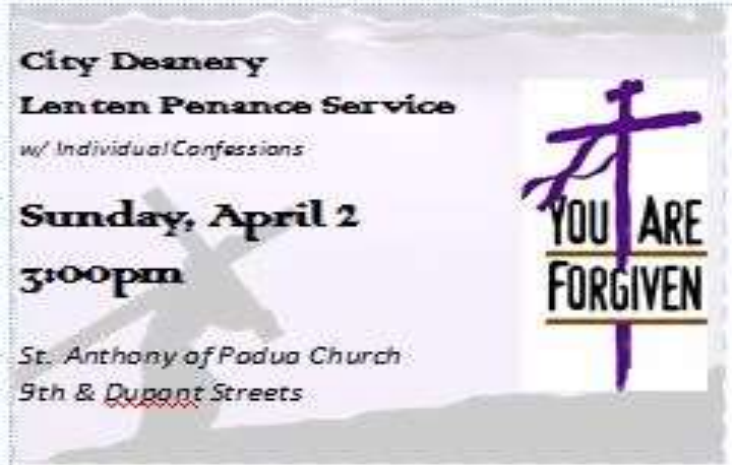
Introduction to the Liturgy

April is Child Abuse Prevention Month

Did you know?

The *Charter for the Protection of Children and Young People* was established by the USCCB in June 2002. It is a comprehensive set of procedures for addressing allegations of abuse of minors. The *Charter for the Protection of Children and Young People* includes guidelines for reconciliation, healing, accountability, and prevention of future acts of abuse.



In this week's gospel from John the account of Jesus raising Lazarus from the dead is revealed to us. It is in this account that Christ says, "I am the resurrection and the life; whoever believes in me, even if he dies, will live, and everyone who lives and believes in me will never die." It is in the raising of Lazarus that this truth is confirmed. With knowledge of this truth, are we living a hope filled life without fear? After learning of Lazarus' death Jesus informs his disciples that he wants to return to Judea where Lazarus had been buried. The disciples question this action, for some in Judea wished to stone him. Despite this fact Jesus still returned. Living out our faith and following God's plan can be difficult, and may even put us in a position to be attacked for our beliefs.

This week I encourage you to pray for the courage to remain faithful to your belief and steadfast in your journey with God.
